




All About Elijah's Law

Elijah's Law is critical legislation designed to enhance allergy safety in childcare environments.



Originating in New York (and now a City Ordinance in NYC), it has since been adopted by Illinois, Virginia, Maryland, California, and Arkansas. There's also a city ordinance in Kansas City that aligns with the principles of Elijah's Law.

Named in honor of Elijah Silvera, who tragically died after consuming a grilled cheese sandwich despite his known dairy allergy, the law mandates stringent allergy management protocols. These include thorough training for childcare staff on recognizing and managing allergic reactions, clear communication of allergy information, and the establishment of personalized emergency health care plans for children with severe allergies.
